
 and let's wish all those children leaving St Mary's Fields this year a successful time at their new schools.

PATCH is a registered charity, which is run by a committee. Our rules state that we will hold an **Annual General Meeting (AGM)** in the summer term. As Covid-19 restrictions did not allow us to do this, we will hold a **Special General Meeting (SGM)** so that the members, which include all parents, carers and helpers of children at the school and the teaching staff, have the chance to:

choose a new committee.

The committee is chosen by an election so if you are interested in joining the committee, we welcome nominations at any time until the meeting begins.

You can nominate yourself or someone can do this for you, with your agreement.

To be nominated or vote at the meeting you must be a parent, carer or helper of a child at the school or teaching staff.
