Uniform

- **School Uniform** - We try to keep our school uniform rules simple and make sure that the items are easily accessible and affordable.
- Black or grey trousers, skirts or pinafore dresses (no jeans, including black denim)
- A white or blue polo shirt, blouse or shirt (with or without school logos)
- Black sensible shoes or black ankle boots (no high-tops, sandals or heels)
- Black or grey plain socks, tights or leggings
- In summer, girls may wear blue school dresses
- No jewellery apart from small, discrete stud earrings and for religious reasons
- No make-up including nail varnish
- No big bows or cat ear headbands etc.



PE Kit

- Black or navy shorts
- Black or navy tracksuit bottoms/leggings
- White/light blue t-shirt
- Trainers
- Black or navy jacket/jumper/hoodie
- Please remember that on PE days long hair should be tied back at all times and jewellery should be removed. Children can continue to wear their PE kit on PE days.
- Please do not let the children wear expensive/designer items for PE or for school and ensure that all items are named. We had a huge amount of lost property last year, which was not claimed or named.



PE Days

- Children are to come into school dressed in their PE kit on PE days.
- Year 3 PE days are: Tuesdays and Fridays.





Equipment

- Children are encouraged to bring water to school and can refill their bottles throughout the day. Please only send water to school in a named, plastic bottle. They can also bring a healthy snack at break time. Fruit and cereal bars are a good example of this.
- Book bag (reading books and reading record).
- Packed lunch (if needed)
- School dinners now require a payment. This can be made through ParentPay. No personal pencil cases because we provide one for the children.
- No mobile phones or other equipment, thank you.

Rewards and sanctions

In Year 3, pupils are positively rewarded by verbal praise and feedback. This can include house point and class marbles.

Raffle tickets are given out as part of an incentive for our reward system – a winning ticket is then drawn at the end of each week where one lucky pupil will win a small raffle prize of their choice.

Children are also chosen for the celebration book on Fridays and can earn school trophies.

On rare occasions a pupil may receive a 'time out' sanction as part of the behaviour management of pupils in line with the schools Behaviour Policy.

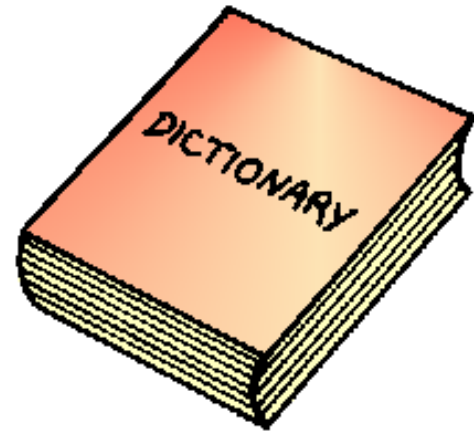
Knowledge Organisers
