There will be rewards for the house with the most House-points each half term. The children will have the opportunity to win 'non-uniform days, film afternoons or House Breakfasts. Houses will also be assigned two House-Captains (from Y6) and they will also be part of the School Council. These will be joined by school council representatives from each year group, voted for by their class.

We open at 8:40am. Your child needs to be in class by 8:50am, if they arrive after this time then they will be marked as late. Please arrive on time.

General messages about the importance of attendance

We know that sometimes our pupils cannot come to school because they are really unwell - and that's the right thing to do for them and other students. Medical advice is clear however that children with mild illness will often be well enough to attend - for example if they have a cough, or cold, without a temperature. The NHS guidance <u>Is my child</u> too ill for school? - NHS (www.nhs.uk) is designed to support parents in their decision making about mild illness.

We also know that pupils fall behind their friends and classmates when they miss school. At St Mary's Fields Academy we want the amount of missed education to be reduced as much as possible. We believe that our community is stronger together, with all of our pupils in school, on time, every day. We are building life skills, life-long friendships and preparing your child for future success.

We also know that you can have a significant effect on absences this academic year and we would really appreciate your help and support ensuring that your child comes to school every day so that they can get the best possible outcomes. We want to work with you to achieve this and we appreciate that every family's situation is unique.

What YOU must do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.

Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.

If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.

Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend. If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

Check your child's attendance every day.

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.



Unauthorised Absences & Term Time Holidays

Working in education we understand the frustration of holidays increasing in price during school holiday times. However, the impact of taking holidays during term time can have a significant impact on a child's achievement and academic progress. It also undermines the school's rich curriculum as key knowledge is missed on their learning journey. Last year the school had issued several penalty notices, which are fines issued by our local authority for term time holidays.

Please take this into account before booking holidays during term time next academic year. There are 175 non-school days during the year in which to take holidays. As detailed below the penalty notices are now more severe and monitoring is over a 3-year basis.

Unauthorised Absences

As part of the new national threshold schools must consider all unauthorised absences for a penalty notice. The new threshold is 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a rolling period of 10 school weeks. A school day is divided in to two registration sessions, AM and PM. If these registrations are missed for unauthorised reasons, it may lead to penalty.

Unauthorised absence can be:

 $\cdot An$ unauthorised holiday, as explained above

Reason has not been established as to why the *child/young person is absent,

•The school is not satisfied that the reason given is one that can be recorded as authorised.

·Being late after registers have closed (Please ensure children are in school by 8:50am)

<u>Fines</u>

Whilst there are many changes, one of the most significant changes are around the penalty notices issued for unauthorised attendance. These fines are per parent, per child and have been increased.

First Offence – The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child, if paid within 21 days

Second Offence (within 3 rolling years) – The second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be: £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 rolling years) – The third time an offence is committed a

Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court.
