




History

The Roman Empire covered much of Europe when it was at its strongest.





The Roman General Julius Caesar made two attempts to invade and conquer Britain. His legions weren't able to overcome the Celts in 55BC or 54BC.

Ninety years later, in 46AD, Emperor Claudius launched a third invasion in Britain. This time Britain (or Britannia as the Romans called it) became part of the Roman Empire.

The Romans gave us many things such as new plants and animals. But they also gave us roads, towns and flushing toilets!
