This links to our Year 1 learning about Christianity. In Year 6 we will learn about Christmas again, thinking especially about Mary.

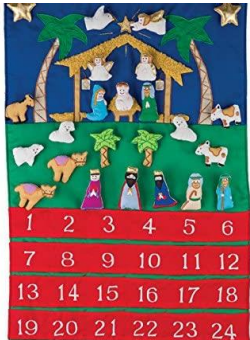




We are word collectors:
