



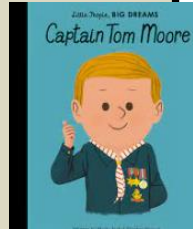
This history unit will focus on Remembrance Day. We will discuss why we observe this national event and the significance behind it.

- We remember brave soldiers like Sir Captain Tom Moore.

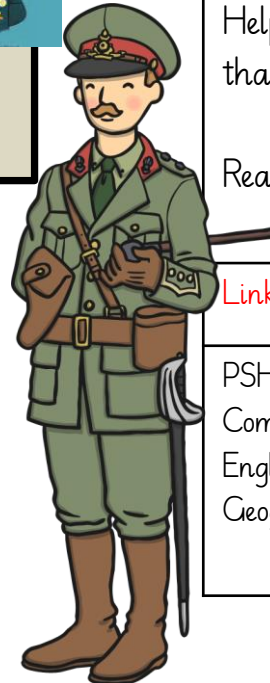


We remember a timeline of events.

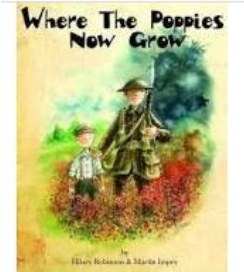
Character Muscles
